RESCISSION OF WATER SHORTAGE ALERT

Bowling Green Mayor, Elaine Walker, and Warren County Judge-Executive, Michael O. Buchanon, have signed a declaration to rescind the “Water Shortage Alert” that was previously issued by Bowling Green Municipal Utilities and Warren County Water District on August 7, 2007. This rescission is pursuant to a de-certification made to them by the General Manager of Bowling Green Municipal Utilities and by the General Manager of Warren County Water District, all in accordance with Chapter 23-2.28 of the Bowling Green Code of Ordinances and Warren County Resolution 99-30WC. This rescission is effective immediately.

The recent rainfall events, coupled with the United States Army Corps of Engineers release of water at Barren River Lake have significantly improved river flows and water quality. The Kentucky Division of Water is also aware of these events and has concurred with us that all conditions calling for the “Water Shortage Alert” no longer exist. BGMU, WCWD and the Kentucky Division of Water have agreed to continue to operate under a “Water Shortage Advisory”, which calls upon all customers of BGMU and WCWD to employ voluntary water conservation and eliminate the waste of all treated water. The recent rainfall continues to leave us at 12 inches below the average for this time of year. The “Water Shortage Advisory” will continue until conditions make it no longer necessary.
