BOWLING GREEN, KY – Kentucky Rural Water Association (KRWA) awarded Warren County Water District with the prestigious Wooden Bucket Award during KRWA’s annual conference held in Lexington, KY earlier last week.

The Wooden Bucket Award is the highest honor presented to a water and/or wastewater utility that has made substantial and lasting improvements in providing high levels of customer service and high quality drinking water and wastewater services in its community.

Warren Water serves a blend of residential, agricultural, commercial and industrial customers. An average 6.4 million gallons of water each day is transported to approximately 24,000 customers along with 4,000 wastewater service customers. To ensure reliable service, Warren Water maintains more than 1,000 miles of pipeline along with 31 pumping stations and 28 storage tanks throughout a 530-square-mile area.
