NATIONAL DRINKING WATER WEEK**

(Bowling Green, KY)- The value of high quality drinking water to healthy lives is being recognized by water utilities nationwide, including the Warren County Water District during National Drinking Water Week (May 2-8). The weeklong event focuses on educating consumers, community members and officials about the role of safe public drinking water in the health, economy and vitality of communities nationwide.

"We can't minimize the importance of a healthy water supply in our daily lives. National Drinking Water Week provides an opportunity to recognize this valuable resource and service," said Alan Vilines, WCWD general manager.

National Drinking Water Week 2010 Campaign, which is hosted by the American Water Works Association (AWWA), is a national advocacy event designed to focus on issues associated with drinking water, including making sure that individuals have fresh, safe tap water and knowledge of how valuable the resource is in their daily lives. According to AWWA literature, here in North America, you can drink from virtually any public tap, while in developing nations worldwide, an estimated two million people die every year from preventable waterborne diseases. The Centers for Disease Control names the disinfection of water as one of the top 10 public health accomplishments of the 20th century.
